Dam Update:

- Bruce filed the quarterly report for our construction grant (Thanks Bruce!). This is something that we need to do to be eligible for the grant money.
- As of Jan 1st we did not have any bills to submit for reimbursement.
- We won't apply for the construction grant before we have the construction permit already.
- Bourings are scheduled for late March/ early April to make sure we know that we won't hit any underground pipes/wires when doing the dam construction
- We are hoping to replace our low level outlet. We will increase the size of the draw down pipe so we can more quickly lower the level on the dam.

The Weed Boat is Taking Shape- Thanks to You and Matt St. Louis!

The vision of the Weed Boat is becoming a reality, and it's all thanks to the dedication of our incredible committee – and one superstar in particular, Matt St. Louis! Matt has poured his heart, time, and talent into designing this boat, working tirelessly to finalize the plan on schedule. He has been the driving force behind the design process with the overall committee's feedback. His dedication is paving the way for this exciting project!

As we've mentioned, January and February are critical months for purchasing the necessary parts. Matt has already procured some key components to complete the design. However, our expenses so far have exceeded what we've raised. That's why your support is so vital if we're going to have this boat ready to launch by Memorial Day weekend!

Here's the exciting news: Matt is gearing up to start cutting and welding next month. Yes, the Weed Boat is officially being built! But how much progress we can make depends on your generosity.

An Added Bonus: A Leaf Boat in the Fall!

As I looked out over the water this past fall, I had a realization – the Weed Boat can double as a Leaf Boat! In October and November, leaves floating on the water's surface eventually sink to the bottom, adding to the muck buildup. With the Weed Boat, we'll be able to harvest those leaves, reducing muck. With the attached trailer, we can transport the weeds and leaves far from the shore – at least 100-200 feet, as recommended.

Weed Boat Fundraising

We're pleased to share that we've raised \$\$8,521 so far! We still need to raise 13,479!

After countless hours of planning and refining, we're confident that \$22,000 will cover the cost of all the parts needed. Thanks to Matt's generosity in donating the frame materials, his shop, and his team's labor, we've managed to reduce our original estimate of \$25,000-\$30,000, saving us \$3,000-\$8,000!



A Change in the Pond


